

Major Field - Form as Poetics

Form is a foundational concept in poetry. It is currently experiencing a resurgence in literary and cultural studies; however, while formal and formally innovative poetry is thriving right now, there is a dearth of poets retheorizing form toward poetics. This list compiles theory on form with an eye toward interdisciplinarity. The goal is to be able to reinvigorate the possibilities for theorizing form toward contemporary poetics. To that end, the list also includes a number of formally noteworthy books of contemporary poetry. This list should help me as a teacher—in teaching both undergraduate and graduate students, both the practice of form and the theory—and as a scholar as I continue to write about form.

This list speaks directly to job market interest in writers versed in form and technique, form and theory, and form and genre, as well as the ability to teach form workshops. More indirectly, this list speaks to interest in interdisciplinarity and hybridity, as well as broader interest in poetics and its relationship to poetic practices.
